RE: Vision health promotion for children in the VCH region

We are writing in our roles as Medical Health Officers with Vancouver Coastal Health to encourage early access to vision care for all children. We are committed to ensuring that all children develop optimally in early childhood and enter school ready to learn. This can be helped through early identification of vision conditions by an optometrist. If identified early, many vision conditions can be corrected and others prevented.

We appreciate your support in sharing the following key messages with the families that you serve:

- Good vision is important for children's learning and development.
- When vision problems are found early, it is often possible to correct them or prevent them from getting worse.
- All children should see an optometrist before kindergarten, ideally by age 3, to start school ready to learn.
 - Find an optometrist in your area through the <u>Find a Doctor of Optometry BC Doctors of</u> <u>Optometry</u> platform
- B.C. Medical Services Plan covers vision check-ups once a year for children under age 19.
 - Some eye clinics have charges associated with children's eye exams.
 - It is a good idea for families to call eye clinics before scheduling an appointment to ask about costs and other services such as languages spoken.
